Field courses offered by the NPW speakers are special add-on opportunities for registered event attendees and participants. These courses are more hands-on workshops that allow event participants and attendees one-on-one instruction from a speaker. Group sizes are kept small. Field course spots are limited, and attendance is not included in your event registration. There will be an additional cost of \$10+tax per field course.

Kevin Adams | "Light Painting Gear & Techniques" Saturday, June 7 | 7 - 8:30 a.m.

Kevin will demonstrate the gear he uses for light painting, both at night and during the day. You will be surprised at how something as simple as a small flashlight can help you create dramatic images of all kinds of subjects.

<u>Chrissy Donadi | "Motion in the Mountains: Intentional Camera Movement (ICM)"</u> Offered Twice:

Looking to create more abstract, expressive images of the natural world? In this field session, we'll explore Intentional Camera Movement (ICM)—a creative technique that blurs the line between photography and painting using slow shutter speeds and deliberate motion.

We'll focus on how to select appropriate subjects, choose the right shutter speeds and control the direction, rhythm and timing of your camera movements while working with natural elements in the landscape. This session is all about exploration over perfection. You'll leave with new tools, new images and a whole new way to play with your camera.

Recommended Gear: A DSLR or mirrorless camera with manual settings, mid-range and telephoto lenses (such as a 24-105mm or longer), and a neutral density (ND) filter to allow for longer exposures in bright conditions. A tripod is optional but not required.

Location: Meet at the entrance to Linville Bluffs, the picnic area located across the park road from the Wilson Center. Feel free to park at the Wilson Center and (carefully) walk across the park road. Very minimal parking is available at the entrance to Linville Bluffs, please save this for attendees with limited mobility.

Georgia Walters | "Selective Focus in a Macro World"

Vinny Colucci and Bill Fortney | "Birds of Prey Photo Shoot"

Vinny Colucci and Bill Fortney, in partnership with Lees-McRae College's May Wildlife Rehabilitation Center, will have an assortment of birds of prey to photograph.

Multiple subjects will be displayed by the keepers, in various backdrop locations, for the group to photograph. Attendees will be able to shoot different subjects throughout the session. Vinny and Bill will go over camera and lens settings to optimize your image. You will have opportunities to ask questions throughout the event as the keepers switch out the subjects.

Lens recommendations are short- to mid-telephotos to isolate the subjects in a portrait setting. 70-200, 100-400, 28-300 or anything in-between will work. 100-300 range is a good range for this event. The faster the aperture, (ie: f/2.8,f/5.6/f6.3) the better to soften your background.

Location: Meet at the entrance to Linville Bluffs, the picnic area located across the park road from the Wilson Center. Feel free to park at the Wilson Center and (carefully) walk across the park road. Very minimal parking is available at the entrance to Linville Bluffs, please save this for attendees with limited mobility. We do expect this to be a busy time around the Wilson Center, so plan to show up a bit early to get parked and to the meeting location.
